

## TNB agrees to resume power supply to factory until Feb 16

**IPOH:** Tenaga Nasional Bhd will resume electricity supply to a plastic manufacturer who allegedly owed RM60,000 pending the outcome of the court case.

TNB lawyer Syahrul Azrin Ghazali said the power company had agreed to continue supplying power to the plastic manufacturer in Teluk Intan until Feb 16.

"Judicial Commissioner Azman Husin had also allowed our application for an adjourn-

ment when the matter was brought up in chambers," he said yesterday.

On Oct 17, the High Court had issued an interim injunction against TNB, compelling the power company to reconnect supply to the factory of Teoh Boon Ping in Pekan Baru, Teluk Intan.

Teoh had filed a suit against TNB for disconnecting power supply to his factory on Sept 22 after TNB had accused Teoh of tampering with the meter.

He said TNB had notified

him that the meter had been tampered with and supply to his factory would be disconnected on June 30.

Teoh, 44, said TNB told him that supply would only be reconnected after he had paid RM59,297.04.

Teoh also claimed that TNB representatives in Teluk Intan refused to explain how they had arrived at the amount.

Teoh's lawyer, Terence Naidu, said he had also applied for permanent reconnection of electricity, and damages.
